Dear Sir,

I have pleasure in informing you that the Executive Board, at its 82nd Session (April-May 1969), decided to admit your Organization to the category of "Information and Consultative Relations" (category B).

Under the terms of paragraph II.3 of the Directives concerning Unesco's relations with international non-governmental organizations, a copy of which is enclosed herewith, admission to this category of relations is restricted to non-governmental organizations which have given proof of their ability to supply Unesco, at its request, with advice on questions coming within their purview, and to contribute effectively by their activities to the implementation of Unesco's programme.

The obligations assumed by organizations in "Information and Consultative Relations", and the advantages they derive from that status are defined in sections III and IV of the aforementioned Directives.

I am confident that fruitful collaboration will develop on this basis between your Organization and Unesco.

Under the terms of paragraph II.7 of the Directives, the relations between the World Federation of Engineering Organizations and Unesco will not become effective until you have notified me of the agreement of the competent body of your Organization.
